“The Judgments of God”

I. The current judgment of believers

I Corinthians 11: 28-32 Hebrews 12: 5-6 I John 1:9

II. The future judgment of believers – Judgment Seat of Christ

Romans 14: 10-12 We are not to judge, everyone will give an account of himself to God.

II Corinthians 5:10 “For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things *done* in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad.” The word “bad” here is worthless.

I Corinthians 3:11-15 The type of building material with which we build – gold, silver, and precious stone or wood, hay, stubble

I Corinthians 4: 1-5 God will judge the hidden things.

III. The judgment of the nations

For their treatment of Israel – Genesis 12: 1-3

For their treatment of humanity – Matthew 25: 31-46 When they were naked, in prison, hungry, thirsty.

For their rebellion against God – Revelation 18 (Babylon) 19:17-19, 21

IV. The judgment of Satan and the fallen angels

Jude 6 (NLT) And I remind you of the angels who did not stay within the limits of authority God gave them but left the place where they belonged. God has kept them chained in prisons of darkness, waiting for the day of judgment.

II Peter 2:4 “For God did not spare even the angels when they sinned; he threw them into hell, in gloomy caves and darkness until the judgment day.”

Revelation 12:7-9 (war in Heaven); 20:1-3 (bound for thousand years); 20:7-10 (devil cast into hell).

V. The judgment of Israel

Ezekiel 20: 33-38 talks about a purging when they gather back into their homeland.

Daniel 12: 1 – they will pay for their sins

VI. The judgment of unbelievers

Revelation 20: 11 -15 - of their works

VII. The judgment of the Cross

John 1:29 - takes away the sin of the world

Acts 20:28 “Purchased with His own blood”

Romans 3: 24 “Justified by His grace”

I Corinthians 15:3 “died for our sins”

II Corinthians 5:15 “Died for all”

Titus 2: 14 (NLT) “He gave his life to free us from every kind of sin, to cleanse us, and to make us his very own people, totally committed to doing what is right.”
